the degree and the last 30 credit hours must be completed at NKU. Students must have an overall GPA of 2.0 and meet all prerequisites for courses and requirements for the major.

Degree requirements for a Bachelor of Arts in Integrative Studies:

- 1) Student must earn a minimum average GPA 2.0 across all coursework
- 2) Student must earn at least a C in each course for any minor or area of specialty and a 2.0 (C average) in each minor or area of specialty. Some minors require higher GPAs/grade minimums. The higher standard applies.)
- 3) Student must complete minors or areas of specialty in three different academic programs.
- 4) At least one content area must be chosen from the College of Arts and Sciences.

Degree Requirement: One course must be selected from the KCTCS identified competence course list in the KCTCS catalog.
